Please give thought to the desirable characteristics that preserve property values in your neighborhood.

Your support and cooperation is important. With that, we will preserve our community standards. It is assumed that all homeowners have been made aware of the WH indentures at property closing. It is also assumed that realtors and listing agents on "For Sale" properties are aware that WH Indentures and "Use Restrictions" are applicable.
